- **John Holloway (Town of Cary)** - representing their "sustainability team" - use B20 diesel for all diesel vehicles, making waste water treatment plants more energy efficient, energy audits continue to look at efficiencies
- **Rick Sapienza (NC Clean Energy Technology Center)** - taking over Ann's role in Transportation, coordinating committee meeting on June 8th, webinar on June 28th: free registration, about the top 3 fleets from the "100 best fleets" seminar. Announcing latest round of CFAT awards soon, have interest in changing the way CFAT is administered/awarded in the future

- **Heather Hildebrandt (NC DOT)** – for CMAQ: surplus of obligated funds so thinking they want to do something more competitive, must be in one of the 24 eligible counties, there will be a minimum project size, projects need to be able to completed quickly/ready to go, will fund up to 80% of the incremental cost. No timeline yet. Contact her if you want more information.
- **Steven Rice (Division of Air Quality)** – Received Best Workplaces for Commuters Award
- **Carmalee Scarpitti (City of Raleigh - Transit)** – rebuild of downtown Raleigh transit station, all LED lighting installed
- **Joe O’Neil (Piedmont Natural Gas)** – two significant customers fueling at their public stations, have opened two private stations for two big waste companies that operate in the region
- **Anne Butler (GAIN Clean Fuels)** – Expanding infrastructure. 40 – 50 vehicles on their used truck store on their website offering ability to buy a truck a few years old but that still works completely fine. Started driver appreciation program where drivers can cash in points earned during fueling online. Offering training/small station demonstrations/etc
- **Randy Paschal (City of Sanford)** – looking at utility electric vehicles for waste water plants, golf courses, etc
- **Kristi Brodd (Advanced Energy)** – Plug-In NC - launching brand new website in June. Workplace charging workshops – one in RTP in July with Clean Cities – inviting local workplaces to come. Duke Energy initiatives for electric bus charging stations (stations provided for free)
- **Jeff Barghout (Nexus EMC)** – autonomous shuttle at Fort Bragg - transporting wounded soldiers to the hospital. Do a lot with autonomous/robotic tech with fleets with ROI in under a year without any incentives, etc. Contact him if interested
- **Brad Willaman (County of Durham)** – first meeting, new to organization
- **Marcy (EVGo)** – majority investor owner coming on board so name may change, 3 more chargers going in ground right now in Triangle area – adds spread and dimension to fast chargers already installed in triangle
- **Antoni Wabui (NC State Transportation)** – 2016 – 2022 sustainability initiatives - reduce GHG emissions and promoting car share, alt fuel vehicles, public transport, etc. Two electric vehicle charging stations installed in March. Hit 3 million riders on public transport on buses/etc
